



# "Holographic" ESUA Curriculum Model:

Year One: Settlement (e.g. Italy)

Year Two: Villages and Towns (e.g. Romania)

Year Three: Cities and Regions (e.g. Norway)

Year Four: Settlements/Villages/Towns (e.g. England)

Year Five: Cities/Regions/The Globe (e.g. Germany)

#### **NOTES ON ESUA CURRICULUM STRUCTURE**

Each year features study in a different country, hosted by one of the ESUA partner universities. This allows intensive study of local histories, cultures, identities, languages, and systems of planning and construction.

#### Workshops, study tours etc:

Introductory study tour of each country:

- "Reader" selection of readings, maps and drawings ahead of time
- Introductory lecture
- Continuing lectures and discussion
- Final report and/or project

WORKSHOP following up on the first study tour

OTHER WORKSHOPS with guest lecturers, architects

OTHER STUDY TOURS as opportunities develop

OTHER MODULES from partner providers and other associates

# Projects:

At least 2 projects per year

Year 1 - studio in local traditional settlement in a rural condition

Year 1 - exercises in more advanced transect conditions (toe-dipping)

Years 2-5 - studios in progressively more complex Transect conditions

Years 2-5 - exercises in more varied conditions

Years 2-5 - Practicals - internships in offices, apprenticeships on construction sites etc

Summer project or Summer School - optional

#### OTHER GOALS:

- "Vertical" studios: students from different years working together
- Projects related to the local country and language
- Projects related to the year and its theme
- Projects of different lengths, varying by year and by parts of the year

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
